

Transforming a Generation









In the earliest days of The Pittsburgh Promise in 2008, our mission was met with great excitement and palpable hope. Simultaneously, students, families, and community members often asked "how long will the scholarship fund last?" But because we had not yet granted any scholarships, we could only answer with "we hope to fund an entire generation of students." In 2016, we had served nine classes of graduates and had access to scholarship utilization and performance data. At that time, we were able to announce specifically which class of graduates from Pittsburgh Public Schools would be the last to receive a Promise scholarship: the high school class of 2028. They were in kindergarten then, and they would be our 21st class of Promise Scholars. To ensure their inclusion, we also announced that we would have to raise \$265 million.

Our endeavor to serve a generation of students through scholarships holds significant meaning to us personally, but it is the transformative ripple effects among families, neighborhoods and our regional workforce that continue to humble us. More than 730 Pittsburgh companies have already hired Promise alums. They are industry leaders and community stewards. They are homeowners and parents whose children now energize the hallways of many schools in Pittsburgh.

We always knew that we were investing in the future leadership of Pittsburgh – in Pittsburgh's promise. We are approaching the tipping point of the realization of that vision. The lasting impact of funding a generation of young people will live within the individuals we've served. They will carry it forward into their families, their communities, and their workplaces. We hope you will enjoy reading a few of their stories throughout this report.

Over the last 16 years, we have learned critical lessons about what it takes to improve access to post-secondary education for underrepresented students. While scholarships remain an essential piece of our work, we know that for many students, a scholarship is not enough to support their post-secondary enrollment, or success. Our direct outreach and public policy initiatives continue to be critically needed.

To help students navigate a complicated and expensive higher education system, and work to alleviate persistent opportunity gaps within Pittsburgh schools, the pilot of Promise Coaches was launched in 2020. Promise Coaches provide critical post-secondary planning, career exploration, and future visioning for students in under-resourced communities. This vital direct outreach has been a lifeline for students and families.

Pennsylvania is one of the most expensive states in the nation to obtain a post-secondary degree. We are actively engaged in advocating for sustainable policy solutions for funding post-secondary education in Pennsylvania. Public policy solutions are necessary to realize a just and thriving statewide economy.

None of our work is possible without more than 4,000 donors who have demonstrated their commitment to Pittsburgh's kids and provided astronomical financial investment in their education.

We are beyond grateful.

Promise Eligibility: Increase For Economically Disadvantaged Students in 2023. The percentage of economically disadvantaged high school seniors who met the combined minimum GPA and attendance requirements to receive a scholarship grew from 35% in 2011 to 46% in 2023. We are hopeful that this could indicate the beginning of a recovery from COVID.

Over half of Promise Scholars are students of color. A full breakdown of our students' demographics is on page 19.

The vast majority of Promise Scholars rely on additional, need-based financial aid to pay for their post-secondary education.

80% are from lower-income homes and may be eligible to receive federal and/or state grants

are from middle-income homes and may not be eligible for government grants, but were for loans



Promise College and Career Success Coaches are moving the needle. With a 2017/18 school year baseline, Promise eliqibility rates decidedly rose in all three Coaching schools, and Promise usage rates are steadily on the rise in all three schools.

Persistence Rates

Every year since the inception of The Pittsburgh Promise, the persistence rates from the first to the second year of college for Pittsburgh Public Schools (PPS) graduates have been on par with or exceeded the national rates. For the years 2009 through 2021, the average persistence rates were:

Honoring our Founding Board Chair, Franco Harris

From early January 2008 and until his death on December 20, 2022, Franco Harris led the Board of Directors of The Pittsburgh Promise. And every step of the way, he moved boulders out of the way of Pittsburgh's kids so that they may be able to run after their dreams. Franco did that with humility, energy, imagination, and even love.

Franco embraced the mission of The Promise because he understood the mission of The Promise. While Franco and his siblings were expected to follow in their father's honorable footsteps, and join the military as their path to economic mobility, it was a scholarship to play football at Penn State University that made it possible for him to get a college education.

And had it not been for that scholarship, the world would have missed out on football legend, on business brilliance, and on human decency of the most authentic kind.

There are countless people out there whose hearts and souls were touched by Franco in deep and abiding ways. He made them – made us – feel very significant and very special. After Franco died, we received many contributions to honor his memory. We also received a few letters describing his impact. Our friend lan Rosenberger wrote the following:

"When I was 9 or so, my dad took me to my first Pirates game. They were playing the Padres. Andy Van Slyke, Bobby Bonilla, and Barry Bonds all started.

As we sat down, my dad pointed to the man in front of us and said quietly "Ian, I want you to introduce yourself, look him in the eye and shake his hand. His name is Franco Harris."

I was nervous. I had no idea who this guy was. I was 9. Finally, during the 7th inning stretch I worked up the nerve. I tapped him on the shoulder, reached out my hand, looked him in the eye and said, "My name is Ian, Mr. O 'Harris, and I'd like your autograph".

He gave me a huge smile and laughed. Then he said something like "so, I'm Irish now." Then he signed my program, 'Best wishes to Ian, from Frank O 'Harris.' I'll never forget it."

Likewise, we will never forget Franco. His impact is indelible.

During my time at Pittsburgh Science and Technology Academy, I immersed myself in the school community, engaging in multiple robotics teams and being an active member of the high school design squad. Together, we had the opportunity to create some cool technology, including hoverboards — a thrilling experience that fueled my curiosity for innovation. However, beyond my various hobbies, my true passion was breaking down barriers for individuals with disabilities, and this passion continues to be a driving force in my life.

My motivation is deeply personal; it stems from the profound relationship I share with my brother and best friend, Jacob. Jacob lives with disabilities that require therapy and assistive technology to help him lead his best and most independent life. It was during his time at Pioneer Academy at Pittsburgh Public Schools, that I witnessed the impact of occupational therapy on Jacob's life. I became committed to pursuing a path that would enable me to help others and ensure accessibility for those with disabilities.

When the time came to choose a post-secondary school, I knew I wanted to stay close to home to be near Jacob.

My decision was driven by a desire to support him while

also seeking opportunities to stretch my financial aid. I enrolled at The University of Pittsburgh for my bachelor's degree with the invaluable assistance of The Promise. Later, I furthered my education and earned my doctorate at Chatham University, which enabled me to achieve the highest degree in occupational therapy.

Today, I am Dr. Evan Buchheit, a board-certified, licensed, and registered occupational therapist. It feels like destiny that I now work at Pittsburgh Public Schools, the very place that sparked my interest in this fulfilling profession. Here, I collaborate day-to-day with some of the therapists who once helped Jacob, and the sense of fulfillment is beyond words.

I am also a proud member of Variety, the Children's Charity of Pittsburgh, and an assistant coach for the Mighty Penguins, an adaptive sled hockey team in Pittsburgh.

My aspiration is to create a culture and a collaborative space where rehabilitation professionals can come together to tackle complex challenges, ultimately benefiting individuals with disabilities in the Pittsburgh area.








Empowering Tomorrow's Leaders

Fostering Ambitious Educational Goals through Scholarships and Programmatic Initiatives

Year after year, The Promise has committed millions of dollars to scholarships, empowering students with the opportunity to pursue post-secondary education, whether through traditional four-year degrees, two-year programs, or vocational and technical credentials.

Beyond financial support, The Promise confronts systemic barriers to equity and access head-on through strategic programs and partnerships, detailed in the pages ahead. Our dedicated Promise Coaches work tirelessly with under-resourced students, nurturing them to recognize their potential, chart their educational journeys, and ultimately transform their futures.

The proportion of graduates meeting GPA eligibility criterion for a Promise scholarship increased from 75% in 2022 to 89% in 2023.








The percentage of economically disadvantaged high school seniors who were eligible to receive a Promise scholarship grew from 36% in 2022 to 46% in 2023.

Core Promise Eligibility

(2.5 GPA and 90% attendance) recorded the highest ever eligibility rate for Black female students- 32% in 2022 to 43% in 2023



While 2023 data reflect movement in the right direction, disparities in high school graduation and Promise eligibility continue to persist between Black and white students and among PPS schools. Although Pittsburgh Public Schools must take decisive action to address inequities, tackling systemic disparities is a shared responsibility that extends beyond the scope of PPS only to all of us within the ecosystem.

From a young age, I held a deep appreciation for education and a strong desire to make a positive impact within my community. The existence of The Pittsburgh Promise scholarship was introduced for the first time to our class in 2008 and it brought immense excitement. I received acceptance letters from four different universities but choosing one was heavily influenced by financial considerations. I thought I would have to settle for a school that I didn't feel was a great fit for me. The Promise granted me the freedom to attend my dream institution, Chatham University. This opportunity held profound meaning not only for me but also for my family.

My first child was born in 2010 while I was working to complete my studies at Chatham. It was during that time that I discovered that I would like to work in social services, or the nonprofit world. After I graduated, I was hired by The Promise as the Scholarship and Development Coordinator, primarily engaged in data entry. My role evolved over the years to managing the entire scholarship program, and now I work as the Strategic Workforce Initiatives Manager, responsible for establishing and facilitating connections between students/scholars and potential companies/career opportunities.

One of the programs that I am overjoyed to oversee is our Advancing Educators of Color (AEC) program. I know firsthand the impact that representation can have on a student's life. My first Black male teacher, Mr. Bala in fourth grade, was a pivotal figure in my education, especially in building my confidence in math. His influence is why I believe so strongly in AEC. These scholars will not only excel as educators, but they will also inspire students who see themselves in their teachers.

My passion for giving back to the community and uplifting the next generation drives everything I do. Beyond my work with The Pittsburgh Promise, and spending time with my three children and husband, I've dedicated my time to organizations like A Plus Schools, Homeless Children's Education Fund, and Oakland Planning Development Corporation. I am deeply committed to programs that open doors for underrepresented populations, giving them access to opportunities that have been historically out of reach.

I've always wanted to help students understand that The Promise is not just a scholarship-- it's a network. The Promise is a big part of the educational and workforce ecosystem in our region. The Promise holds a deeply personal significance to me outside of my role as a staff member and alum, as it represents the embodiment of both opportunity and connection. Beyond financial assistance, it has demonstrated to me and those that have come after me that our aspirations are within reach, and that a network of people is dedicated to witnessing our success.

Together, we can build a diverse, equitable, and inspiring community where every voice is heard, every talent is nurtured, and every child sees a future full of possibilities.







Breaking Barriers, Building Bridges

Breaking Educational Barriers through Outreach, Equity Initiatives, and Partnerships

Our data show that even with the availability of significant financial support, too few PPS 9th graders graduate from high school, enroll in postsecondary education, and earn a credential. This perpetuates inequities for under-resourced communities and creates significant workforce challenges for our region's economy. By breaking these educational barriers, we can initiate a cycle of generational transformation and economic mobility. Our efforts to address educational barriers remain essential to our mission and vital to our students.

Promise Coaches

The work of college and career success coaching was built-in our programming from day one. Whether through professional educational outreach workers or trained peer Promise Ambassadors, direct service to help students learn about and plan for their unique pathways after high school has always been central to our mission. In 2020, we launched The Promise Coaches as an initiative to accelerate this work and effectively reach students at high schools where college-going had been substantially lower than at other PPS schools.

Promise Coaches work in partnership with PPS staff and community stakeholders, and focus intentionally on providing personal career exploration, mental strengthening, and appropriate interventions to every high school student starting in the 9th grade. We piloted Promise Coaches inside three high schools: Carrick (South Pittsburgh), Milliones (Hill District), and Perry (North Side). In 2024 we announced that Coaches would become a permanent part of our work and that we would expand to Westinghouse (Homewood) in the fall of 2024.

The ultimate goal of Promise Coaches is unabashedly aspirational: grow the percentage of 9th graders who earn a post-secondary credential within ten years to 80% by 2034. This is a long-term goal that requires a full decade to measure (4 years of high school + 6 years of post-secondary).


Our data highlight significant achievements in key metrics by Promise Coaches. The most significant impacts were among Black and economically disadvantaged students. These factors have traditionally impacted the pursuit of post-secondary options by young people. Coaches honor the struggles their students face and find ways to encourage and guide them toward future-focused decisions.




On average, 64% of 12th graders in our coaching schools received services from the Allegheny County Department of Human Services in school year 2022-2023, and 72% lived in economically-disadvantaged households.

Promise eligibility rates decidedly rose in all three Coaching schools, and Promise usage rates are steadily on the rise in all three schools. Specifically:

It's noteworthy that more Milliones/UPrep graduates have started to enroll in 4-year post-secondary schools instead of 2-year programs. Data show Promise Scholars are more likely to persist toward a post-secondary credential if they begin their post-secondary education at a 4-year school.

Promise Coaching is central to the mission of The Pittsburgh Promise. Economic mobility for our students depends on their post-secondary attainment, and our region's workforce depends on highly skilled and credentialed individuals. Coaching allows all of our young people, including those who traditionally face unfair barriers, to choose careers with family-sustaining wages leading to generational wealth and a culture of learning and contributing to our community.

Programs and Outreach

PROMISE AMBASSADORS are high school seniors who serve as peer coaches and outreach workers. They promote post-secondary enrollment and advocate for the use of Promise scholarships. Promise staff employ and train Ambassadors in communication, as well as financial aid and post-secondary planning. The program offers an excellent opportunity to develop important communication, organization, and leadership skills.





the year and ensure that students can visit all our Preferred College Partner schools and consider post-secondary options across the commonwealth. For many students, this is the only college tour they will attend. Promise Ambassadors are required to join us on college tours so they can relay their experiences to students who may choose not to attend.

PROMISE COLLEGE FAIR is an annual college fair exclusive to The Promise's Preferred College Partners. Students are encouraged to explore their post-secondary option at this, and other college fairs offered in the community. At our most recent college fair, our Preferred Partners extended more than 400 "on the spot" acceptances and over \$2 million in scholarships.





TRANSITION POSSIBILITIES is an annual event organized by The Promise and open to all Pittsburgh Public Schools students who identify as having a disability with or without an Individualized Education Program or 504 plan. The Promise provides information about post-secondary opportunities and coordinates with community partners, like the Office of Vocational Rehabilitation, to share information about vital resources available to students.



SENIOR CELEBRATION DAY is a high energy, annual event that brings together seniors from all PPS high schools to recognize and celebrate their post-secondary plans, be that a four-year or two-year college, a trade or technical school, military service, or joining the workforce.

students the opportunity to experience college-level coursework and earn college credit. The Promise provides early access to Promise scholarship funds that may await eligible juniors and seniors upon graduation to pay for select courses. Dual Enrollment allows students to take courses at a reduced cost, explore fields of study, and complete essential courses while still in high school.





CAREER DAY is an annual event for students in our coaching schools that inspires their post-high school plans. Over 130 volunteers from different sectors join us to showcase their industry, share their expertise, and spark the passions of eager young minds.

career Launch is a partnership with more than 40 companies that support our work. This annual event has introduced talented Promise Scholars and Alumni to professional contacts, potential internships, and full-time employment. Career Launch offers Promise Scholars and Alumni exclusive access to available internships and jobs during peak hiring seasons.

Equity Initiatives

We structure our scholarship to avoid exacerbating systemic inequities in a few important ways:

Without Exception

Without Exception: The Promise is committed to ensuring that the scholarship is accessible to all students of all abilities, some of whom may require special accommodations or extra time. This includes students who have IEPs (Individualized Education Programs) and 504 plans.

Extension Scholarship

Extension Scholarship: Students who graduate from high school and meet the residency, enrollment, and attendance requirements, but have a cumulative GPA of 2.0-2.49, are eligible to enroll in The Promise Extension Program. These students must use their scholarship at CCAC, a Promise Preferred College Partner, or at a non-CCAC offered program (example: cosmetology programs). In their first year, students must complete 18 credits and maintain a 2.0 GPA. Those who successfully complete a full year in the Extension Program may then use their Promise scholarship for any Pelleligible post-secondary program in Pennsylvania.

Compassion Appeals

Compassion Appeals: An appeals process helps us to ensure eligibility for students who experience life-events beyond their control like illness or homelessness. The Promise shares data with Allegheny County Department of Human Services (DHS) to safeguard the eligibility of students who receive DHS assistance. Students and advocates can also submit appeals individually.

Preferred Cellege Partners

These institutional partnerships strengthen relationships between
The Pittsburgh Promise and post-secondary institutions that provide
additional financial aid and robust support services for Promise Scholars.

Over and above The Promise scholarship and other institutional aid, PCPs commit to reducing the cost of room and board by at least \$2,000. Importantly, the schools also provide targeted transition and academic support services to ensure student retention and success.

When I was in 11th grade, I had my future all planned out—or so I thought. My family didn't have the money to send me to college, so I enlisted in the military planning to use their help to attend college someday. I had a ship date set right after my senior year. But then, during that crucial final year of high school, The Pittsburgh Promise visited our school and talked about the opportunity to receive \$5,000 a year to attend any higher education institution in Pennsylvania. That visit changed everything for me

With the help of The Pittsburgh Promise, I enrolled at Penn State Greater Allegheny for two years before transferring to University Park to complete my bachelor's degree in petroleum and natural gas engineering. If I had gone into the military, I don't believe I would be in the position that I am today. Our nation was at war at that time. The Pittsburgh Promise opened doors I never thought were possible.

After graduating, I worked as a Petroleum Engineer for almost 10 years. It could have been a decent career, but in 2021, I decided to pursue a personal dream and started Triple 3 Construction. As a union employer, signatory to the carpenters, we have had as many as twelve carpenters in the field. We specialize in commercial interiors. Our projects have included significant landmarks like the FNB Tower and the Lemieux Suites at PPG Paints Arena.

I purchased a home in Brookline shortly after graduation and now have a couple rental properties in McKeesport. My wife, Moriah, is a nurse at Allegheny General Hospital, and we have two beautiful daughters, Jordyn and Leah. Being the first in my family to go to college, I will now know how to navigate higher education when the time comes for my kids. Hopefully one of them will take an interest in Triple 3 Construction, potentially turning it into a family business that continues to build generational wealth.

The Pittsburgh Promise is a tremendous program that had a considerable impact on my life. The connections I have made within The Promise have touched every milestone in my life. Saleem, the Executive Director of The Promise, officiated my wedding. A Promise alumnus, Jahmiah, helped me get my first internship. Through the Promise, I connected with my mentor, Alex, who helped me transition my company from residential to commercial work. Without my scholarship, and the network I gained through The Promise, I wouldn't be where I am today, and for that, I am eternally grateful. Knowing firsthand the life changing impact of this program, my wife and I proudly paid it forward by donating over \$25,000 to The Promise over the last few years. Contributing to such a meaningful cause brings us immense joy. And I'm proud to be able to tell my girls that we've been a part of something greater by giving life-changing opportunities to others.







Unlocking Generational Potential

Transformative Impact of Promise Scholarships on Post-Secondary Access, Enrollment, and Economic Mobility

The Pittsburgh Promise provides \$20,000 scholarships to attend a university, college, trade or technical school in Pennsylvania. Many Promise Scholars stand as pioneers, representing the first in their families to embark on the journey of higher education. Through scholarships, we are not just investing in individuals; we are nurturing the seeds of generational transformation, ensuring that the promise that lives in our youth blossoms into brighter futures for them, their families, our workforce, and our region.

To earn a Promise scholarship, students must:

Be Enrolled

in Pittsburgh Public Schools

continuously since the 9th grade

Live

in the City of Pittsburgh

continuously since the 9th grade

Graduate

in or before 2028

with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50 (2.00 for extension scholarship) and an attendance of 90%

Post Secondary Enrollment

Nationally and locally, college enrollment was detrimentally impacted by the pandemic. Nationally, post-secondary enrollment dropped 4 percentage points between 2019 and 2022 and 6 percentage points for Pittsburgh Public Schools students. Seamless college enrollment in 2019 (meaning enrollment the fall after high school graduation) for PPS graduates compared to the U.S. Census were 54% and 66% respectively. In 2022 those numbers dropped to 48% and 62% respectively. With the very disruptive rollout of the 2024 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), our country is once again bracing itself for another decline in college enrollment.

Declines in college enrollment represent a serious concern for our region and the state at large. While

these issues are multi-factorial, the rising cost of higher education and the expense of an in-state degree in Pennsylvania are no doubt contributing factors. These discouraging trends continue to underscore the need for public policy solutions to make higher education affordable for all students across the commonwealth.

The Promise is actively engaged in efforts to address declines in enrollment and scholarship usage. In

addition to the direct outreach work of Coaches, our staff launched a "reach back" campaign to 568 scholars who had been Promise eligible but had no enrollments for 2023. Initial results found 30 students who were already enrolled in college, 18 of whom were able to start receiving Promise funds immediately. This is slow and steady work, but we are pleased that an additional 20 students responded with interest in enrolling in school within a year. Those students are working with Promise staff to explore their path forward.



Persistence Rates

PPS graduates stay in college at a slightly higher rate than the nation's average. Every year since the inception of The Pittsburgh Promise, the persistence rates from the first to the second year of college for Pittsburgh Public Schools (PPS) graduates have been on par with or exceeded the national rates compiled by the National Student Clearinghouse. This is significant as national rates include students of all demographics and PPS graduates represent a population of students that is the vast majority low-income. For the years 2009 through 2021, persistence rates were:



It is also encouraging that the persistence of Black graduates of Pittsburgh Public Schools has risen 15% over the past two years to now meet national averages for Black. to now meet national averages for Black collegegoers at 66%.

So, as we are successful in increasing postsecondary enrollment for these students, we can also expect that persistence and degree attainment rates are likely to go down, because we have brought more students into the college pool who have more significant challenges. Broadening access to postsecondary enrollment is a positive outcome for a community, even though follow on indicators may drop—we've just brought students into the pool who were not previously included." 



It is well-documented that the presence of Black teachers in the education of Black students has transformative impacts on students' vision for their futures as well as academic outcomes.



These include higher educational attainment, lower dropout rates, and reduced disciplinary actions. Unfortunately, many students move through their K-12 education without being taught by a Black educator.

Thanks to the breathtaking generosity of the Demchak family, The AEC program provides a full-ride scholarship on top of the Promise Scholarship to eligible Pittsburgh Public Schools students who pursue education and jobs within PPS after graduation. Students chosen for the scholarship are deemed Demchak Scholars of The Pittsburgh Promise. This scholarship, in partnership with Pittsburgh Public Schools, eliminates financial burdens and provides mentorship, networking, and professional development to students that are dedicated to the profession of education, along with the guarantee of employment once they gain certification.

Public Policy Action is Critical to Securing Pennsylvania's Future

Pennsylvania is on the brink of a critical challenge: by 2035, the state is projected to face a shortfall of 770,000 skilled workers. With over a million members of today's workforce set to retire and many others migrating out, the jobs of tomorrow—largely driven by new technologies—will demand a workforce with post-secondary credentials.

Of course, this does not mean that we will have that many vacant jobs. Instead, we will have that many fewer jobs because employers will leave the Commonwealth.

This impending workforce shortage isn't just a statistic; it's a potential economic crisis. Pennsylvania's public university system is one of the most expensive in the nation. Declining enrollment numbers reflect the financial burdens on families. More and more students are opting for out-of-state institutions or forgoing higher education altogether, leading to a shrinking pool of talent for Pennsylvania industries.

To ensure PA can capture the benefits of its projected future job growth, 65% of our residents must have a post-secondary credential by 2035. Today, we are at only 53%. Meeting this goal will require bold public policy action to expand access to affordable education, align workforce training with the needs of high-growth industries, and create opportunities for both traditional students and adult learners to obtain the skills necessary for the jobs of the future.

Programs like The Pittsburgh Promise have shown the transformative impact of investing in education. Scaling such efforts statewide can help close the skills gap and secure Pennsylvania's economic future.

We must act now. Public policy that prioritizes education and workforce development is critical to ensuring Pennsylvania's competitiveness and economic vitality in the years to come. We at The Pittsburgh Promise pledge to continue to work with elected officials, and business, civic, and educational leaders to design transformational efforts that are worthy of our people and up to the challenge that is in front of us now.
