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Local Scholarship Opportunities

- o [The Pittsburgh Promise Scholarship](#)
 - A “last-dollar” scholarship for Pittsburgh Public Schools graduates (and graduates of its charter schools); provides up to \$5,000 per year (maximum \$20,000) toward college, training, or trade school costs in Pennsylvania. Final HS class eligible to receive the scholarship is class of 2028.
 - [Pittsburgh Promise Preferred College Partners](#)
 - o These schools offer additional \$2,000+ housing grants for Promise students.
 - [Financial Aid Support - Pittsburgh Promise](#)
- o [The Pittsburgh Foundation Scholarships](#) (open in January; deadline end of February)
 - A collection of scholarship funds managed by The Pittsburgh Foundation, open in January, supporting a wide variety of majors, interests, and student backgrounds.
- o [Pittsburgh Public Schools Scholarships](#) (open in the spring; deadline end of April)
 - District-based scholarships for PPS students, typically opening in the new year; eligibility, amounts, and criteria vary.
- o [Pittsburgh History and Landmarks Foundation](#)
 - \$1,500 per year for four years (total max of \$6,000); Deadline = mid-April; Open to those with a 3.25 GPA and higher.
- o [NEED Foundation Grants](#)
 - Grants supporting African American and underrepresented students in Western Pennsylvania in pursuing postsecondary education.
- o [POISE Foundation Scholarships](#)
 - Scholarships aimed at African American students in the Pittsburgh region, offering financial support and community development opportunities.
- o [Housing Authority: Clean Slate E3 Scholarship](#)
 - Scholarship for residents of the Housing Authority of the City of Pittsburgh who are pursuing postsecondary education.

 - Scholarship for students who have been adopted, are/were in the foster care system, or have another alternate form of residency. \$500 - \$1,750 scholarships.

 - Scholarship opportunities for Jewish students in Allegheny County pursuing higher education.

 - \$1,000 renewable scholarship for four years. Deadline in April.
- o [Canady Scholar-Athlete Award](#)
 - \$1,000 per year scholarship, must have 3.3 or higher GPA.

 - Scholarships awarded to high-performing students in Western PA based on academics, leadership, and character.
- o [Homeless Children's Education Fund](#): Hope Through Learning Scholarship
 - Support for students who have experienced homelessness, offering financial awards and mentoring. Up to age 24.
- o [Kyle B. Wilson Scholarship](#) (opens in January, deadline in July)
 - \$1,000 scholarships for residents of Allegheny and surrounding counties.
- o [Trib Total Media Scholarships](#) (Deadline = mid-January)
 - Annual \$7,500/year scholarships in media and business fields.
 - [The Jim Borden Memorial Scholarship](#) (Journalism, English Writing, Communication majors).
 - [Scholarship for Diversity in Media](#) (open to students who are culturally, ethnically, or racially diverse and majoring in Journalism, English Writing, or Communications) .
 - [The Business, Marketing, and Technology Scholarship](#) (Business, Marketing, Computer Science, or IT majors).
- o [Schrager Defense Attorneys Scholarship](#) (deadline = mid-October)
 - For current college students (GPA 3.0+) who show academic excellence and community engagement.

 - Two \$600 scholarships awarded. Essay is required.

 - \$200 - \$2,000 scholarship awards for underrepresented students planning to pursue careers in architecture or design.

 - Support for students in Allegheny County of Protestant faith pursuing postsecondary education.

 - [PATH Grant Program](#) (Promise will contact you to complete a Form, we'll then nominate you to PHEAA. You MUST qualify for Pittsburgh Promise and the PA State Grant and have a remaining unmet need in order to qualify)
 - [PA Ready to Succeed Scholarship Program](#) (\$500-\$2,500) (Must be sophomore and above in college to apply - talk with your college about the nomination process!)
 - [Chafee Grant](#) (Administered by PHEAA and open to students who've been in foster care)
 - [Fostering Independence Tuition Waiver](#) (Waives tuition and fees for Pennsylvania students who were in foster care)
- [PACAC Scholarship](#) (deadline = early February)
 - Offered by the Pennsylvania Association for College Admission Counseling for eligible PA high school seniors.

 - Highly selective, last-dollar scholarship for outstanding high school seniors from low-income backgrounds; covers the cost of attendance not met by other aid.
- o [Coca Cola Scholarship](#) (Deadline end of August; scholarship for upcoming senior class)
 - National scholarship recognizing academic excellence, leadership, and community service among high school seniors.
- o [Jack Kent Cooke Foundation Scholarship](#) (Deadline = mid-November)
 - Full-ride scholarship for high-achieving, low-income students, including support beyond just tuition.
- o [Last Mile Scholarship](#) For current college students in final semester or two (STEM and computer science)
 - Assists college students in their final semesters (especially STEM/computer science) to reach degree completion.
